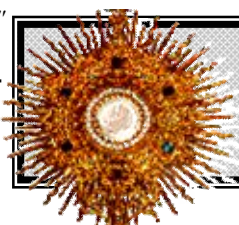

The Week Ahead

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



• Sunday 14

1 Sam 3:3-10, 19, Psalm 39:2, 4, 7-10,
St John 1:35-42

We have been called by Christ to become children of God. How we respond is illustrated in Today's Readings. There is a seeking which develops into a search that leads to seeing and believing.

• Monday 15

1 Sm 15:16-23, Psalm 49:8-9, 16-17, 21, 23,
St Mark 2:18-22

Saul is failing as king because he does not act with authority. He allows the people to make decisions even though he knows they are not according to God's plan. Obedience, he is told, is better than sacrifice.

St Ita was born in Co. Waterford of noble and Christian parents. Early on she set her mind on serving Christ in religious life. She founded a monastery in Killeedy, Co. Limerick, which attracted a great variety of young people. She was given the title 'foster-mother of the saints of Ireland'. She died in 570.

• Tuesday 16

1 Sm 16:1-13, Psalm 88:20-22, 27-28,
St Mark 2:23-28

The Sabbath was to give freedom to all. The Christian Sunday is a day of joy and celebration of the freedom given by the Risen Christ. It unites all Christians in its observance.

St Fursa was born in Ireland and became one of the great monastic missionaries abroad. He went first with his brothers Foillan and Ultan to live the monastic life in East Anglia. But as great numbers continued to visit him there he left Foillan as abbot and sought refuge in France around 644. A patron gave him a hermitage at Logny on the Marne. He died about 650 at Mezerolles and was buried in Peronne, which became a great centre of devotion to him.

St Mark 3:1-6

In the work for Christian unity it is necessary not to lose confidence in God, who can work through weak human instruments.

St Anthony, died 356. 'Father of monasticism,' lived a life of solitude but also attracted many others to form communities of hermits.

Jonathan brings a reconciliation between David and Saul. Jesus brings healing to many afflicted.

79:2-3, 5-7, St Mark 3:20-21

At every Mass, the Church prays for unity and peace, mindful of the prayer of Jesus: 'may they all be one.'

St Fabian had been Pope for fourteen years when martyred under Decius in the year 250.

St Sebastian may have been a soldier and was martyred in the persecution of Diocletian. He sustained many others in their trials.
